

## Step 1: Application for Enrolment (not required for current Glennie students)

An application for enrolment at The Glennie School must be received two weeks prior to the scholarship examination day. The online application form can be found <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>.

### Step 2: Register

Applicants must register to be considered for the Helene Orton Scholarship via this link.

Requirements for registration for the Helene Orton Scholarship:

- Cover Letter written by the applicant, explaining why they would like to be considered for a scholarship.
- Resume a one to two-page resume listing the applicant's performing arts achievements e.g.
   AMEB exam grade and results, awards, participation in ensembles and programs etc.

   Submission of original certificates is not required, however, may be requested.
- Referees the names and contact details for two relevant referees.
- Application Fee \$30 payment can be made at Main Reception in person or via phone (07) 4688 8888.

#### **Due Date**

All components must be submitted by Friday, 16 February 2024. No late submissions will be accepted.

#### Other Information

Short-listed applicants will be invited to audition.

Applicants are not required to sit the Scholarship Examination, however, may do so should they wish to also be considered for other Glennie scholarships.

### Helene Orton Performing Arts Scholarship Conditions

- Scholarships offered will apply as a reduction to base tuition fees. Where appropriate, the scholarship may be offered to be applied to boarding fees. It does not extend to other charges, such as comprehensive fees, the cost of laptop hire or extra-curricular charges.
- It is also possible for auditionees to be awarded the Helene Orton Performing Arts Commendation. The Commendation entitles the student to private instrumental or voice lessons to the value of \$1,100 per annum, for the duration of the scholarship. The co-curricular lessons are to be organised through the School's Performing Arts Centre. Where a tutor is not available at Glennie or a student is currently learning with an external tutor, external lessons may be approved by the Head of Arts and Performance by making this request in writing.
- The scholarship and commendation are tenable from Term 1 2025 until the end of Year 12, subject to continuing adherence to the Scholarship Conditions below.

- The holder of this scholarship and commendation will be required to:
  - be an active participant in a minimum of three Performing Arts co-curricular ensembles on the awarded instrument
  - o achieve ongoing high performance standards in their awarded instrument
  - o uphold and enhance the ethos, values and traditions of the School
  - o maintain appropriate academic standards and uphold the terms and conditions of enrolment
  - attend an annual performance review with the Head of Arts and Performance in Term 3 of each school year.
- A student may be the recipient of one School discount only. A student who is awarded and accepts a higher value discount forfeits the previous one.
- This offer is conditional on a successful enrolment interview (new students).
- The scholarship will be reconsidered should your parent account fall into arrears.
- Scholarship offers are not negotiable.
- Scholarship offers are confidential.
